Ellie (Eljadran Halasha) 2010 Summer Cup Winner

Ellie came to us as a rescue dog after her owner surrendered her to Sabine Mueller at the end of August 2010. She was 3 kilos underweight due to an eating disorder, suffering from a kidney infection and exhibited symptoms of chocolate poisoning. It wasn't until the end of October that her health and fitness had improved enough to take her out for our usual 4km morning walks with her sister, although she found them tiring.

Our intentions were to get her fit and healthy during the following year and we decided to take her to Lure Coursing meets to allow her to stretch out in a safe environment. She started off with a puppy run, then a half run, and each time refused to be caught and was drawn in using the lure, but not before she had done multiple race circuits. This showed that she was keen and confident although not quite fit enough or smart enough for competitive work.

During November and December she was progressively trained using the walk/trot method and interval training to build up her ligaments and muscles, as well as careful free running in predesigned courses at home. (I take my lure coursing seriously). We decided to try her out during the Summer Cup given that the course lengths were shorter and there is only one race per day, thereby preventing excessive buildup of lactic acid and heat in the muscle tissues. Our main concern was catching her after the run in order to prevent her over exerting herself.

Her first run drew gasps from the onlookers as she manoeuvred around the twists, turns and dips in the course. She lengthened and shortened her stride to optimise her speed yet stayed close to that lure. She gave it everything she had and I worried that she had overdone it, but no; on returning to the pen she took off again, full of herself, avoiding the catchers and laughing as she mischievously skipped around us...and that was when I knew that she is something special.

"Ellie the Huntress", "Ellie the Conquerer", "Ellie Forever Free"

Naadirah Zafina called her in to the fence and she stayed put until harnessed.

She wasn't run at the January meet as the weather was too bad to risk her slipping and injuring herself. She was after all, only in training.

In February, despite the heat and humidity she showed the same keenness and set out with great determination to bring that lure home and this time she ran straight into the back of the catching pen, bouncing off the webbing. She turned to rush out again but we had placed Zafina behind her to block her exit, and like a dutiful pup she checked, waiting for Zafina's permission to move. Her second run had ended but she was keen to go again, however, I cooled her down and she was encouraged to rest.

As a granddaughter of Ch. Kasaque Kaenra LCM. ET(aka Sadik), and a grandniece of Sandwind Adamii Mastara FCh(Sami), she is blessed with the genes to do well, combined with her desire and motivation, this little girl demonstrated she has what it takes to be a champion. Although she has a long way to go, considering that she has only done two full runs, her determination, enthusiasm will see her progress and mature into a top courser.

At 14 months of age, she showed immense courage to conquer the course on her own, with the single mindedness and focus of a more mature dog, but with the determination and spirit of what is the embodiment of a Saluki.

Well done Ellie ! A Joy to Own, A Thrill to Behold, and a Credit to Your Breed.

DID YOU KNOW?

Cinnamon, which gives us that warm and fuzzy feeling, is the super spice that comes from the bark of an Asian evergreen tree. So comforting sprinkled on our grandma's rice pudding, it conjures up gorgeous memories of our childhood—a true aromatic spice.

It's also good to know that cinnamon contains health-promoting anti-oxidants such as cinnamaldehyde, which is thought to help with blood flow. Probably the most promising benefit of this spice is its effect on blood sugar levels. In one study of 60 people with type 2 diabetes, researchers found that after 40 days of taking 1/2 teaspoon of cinnamon, blood sugar levels and blood lipid levels were reduced by up to 29% and this appeared to last for 20 days.

Bottom line is that there is a real cinnamon diabetes connection. However, there are many types of cinnamon and related species marketed as cinnamon. Make sure you know which type you are buying if you choose cinnamon as a treatment for diabetes. If you have any questions, please consult your doctor.

What are the Benefits of Cinnamon?

Cinnamon has extremely high anti-oxidant activity, and the oil of cinnamon has strong anti-bacterial and anti-fungal properties. Cinnamon is also a great source of manganese, fiber, iron, and calcium. As a result, it has been used as an effective home remedy for:

- Reducing blood sugar levels and treating Type 2 Diabetes.
- Lowering cholesterol.
- Aiding digestion.
- Treating diarrhea.
- Curing the common cold.
- Reducing arthritis pain.
- Boosting memory and cognitive function.
- Treating toothaches.
- Eliminating bad breath.
- Curing headaches and migraine pain.

Where and How to Buy Cinnamon

The powdered cinnamon that we commonly use as a spice is typically Cassia cinnamon, and can be found in most grocery stores. It can also be purchased in stick form. **Ceylon cinnamon** is typically more expensive than Cassia cinnamon, and is therefore usually only available in specialty stores. It is usually only available in stick form. While both types are known for their therapeutic effects, the Ceylon cinnamon is slightly sweeter and is therefore considered to be of higher quality.

Many health food and nutrition stores also sell Cinnamon in a capsule form, which simplifies the consumption process

What are the Side Effects of Cinnamon?

Some recent studies in Europe have shown that cinnamon derived from the Cassia plant contains a toxic compound known as *Coumarin*. This compound is known to cause liver and kidney damage in high concentrations. Since the powdered cinnamon that we purchase in our **supermarkets** is typically derived from the **Cassia plant**, **it is important to avoid consuming high doses of it.**

Since cinnamon has an anti-clotting effect on the blood, caution should also be exercised when it is used in combination with other blood-thinning products such as aspirin. Large quantities of cinnamon should also be avoided during pregnancy due to the possibility of adverse effects on the uterus.

Anyone that is currently taking medication for controlling blood sugar levels or blood thinners should consult their doctor before using cinnamon as a regular supplement.

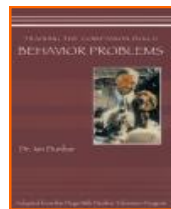


Dr Ian Dunbar

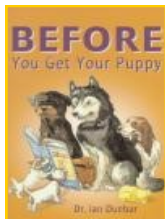

Dr. Dunbar received his veterinary degree and a Special Honors degree in Physiology & Biochemistry from the Royal Veterinary College (London University) and a doctorate in animal behavior from the Psychology Department at the University of California in Berkeley, where he spent ten years researching olfactory communication, the development of hierarchical social behavior, and aggression in domestic dogs. Dr. Dunbar is a member of the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons, the California Veterinary Medical Association, the Sierra Veterinary Medical Association, the American Veterinary Society of Animal Behavior, and the Association of Pet Dog Trainers (which he founded)—the largest and most influential association of pet dog training in the world. Dr. Dunbar is currently Director of the Center for Applied Animal Behavior in Berkeley, California, where he lives with his wife Kelly, their dogs Claude, Dune, Hugo-Louis, and cats Uggs and Mayhem. 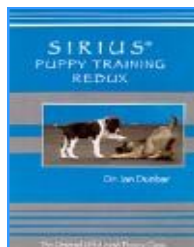

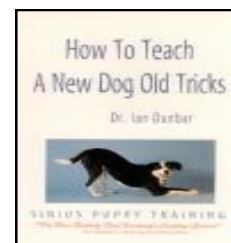

A recommendation will be made by the Committee to the next General Meeting, that puppies must be aged between 6 and 9 months to be eligible to run in the puppy runs.

PEDIGREE CERTIFICATION:

Please be aware that all dogs, where the owner has not provided a copy of ANKC/CCC or related papers of an official body, cannot take part in our yearly competition and will not be graded.

Where owners have not produced copies of papers, the dog/s must run in the Unregistered

Mixed breeds section.

New members are granted three meets, where their dog can run with the regular breeds.

If the papers are not provided for the next meet, the dog will be placed in the Unregistered Section. The exception is the Greyhound, where the Race Secretary or other appointed official will view the ear brands in both ears and note them down, instead of a pedigree.
