# Beagles

It is generally accepted that what we would refer to as the "modern" Beagle...or the small compact hunting dog...originated in the hills and fields of ancient Britain and France. In the days of nobles and peasants, nobles had at their command nearly unlimited resources. These nobles kept large packs of large hounds like Foxhounds, Talbot hounds and others. Lower Class nobles and peasants, lacking the resources to keep and maintain these large pack of large hounds but still needing a good strong hunting companion, developed smaller hounds. These smaller hounds were easier and cheaper to maintain. The name Beagle is believed to come from the Celtic word "beag", meaning small.

The small agile hound quickly gained famed reputation, the Beagle proved to be a skilled and tenacious hunter and, in some ways, surpassing its larger cousins in the field.

The Beagles was bred to hunt rabbit and hares and is a dedicated hunter, having a powerful nose, a strong sturdy body, and very good agility, the Beagle is perfectly suited for this task.

The Beagle was bred to work in a pack, packs can consist of just a few dogs to as many as several dozen. The Beagle is generally merry and fun loving, preferring to play and have a good time to any sort of disagreement and should be good with other animals, good with kids, non aggressive, and easily trained.

The Beagle has a fun and curious nature, much like many children. Truth be told, in many ways having a Beagle in your home is somewhat like having another child. They are inquisitive and playful and generally very cooperative with children...but like children, will need to be supervised.

Beagles are single minded...or focused. When choosing any breed, you need to consider how that dogs breeding might effect its behaviour. Beagles are often referred to as stubborn and it is true that they are not always obedient. Obedience in a dog is most often thought of a responding to commands and direction given by a handler. If this is obedience, well perhaps the Beagle was bred to be disobedient. The Beagle and other hounds, unlike many sporting breeds, were not bred to hunt by following the commands of their handler. The Beagle was bred to be loose in the field and go out, on its own, making decisions for itself, without interaction from a human handler. This has created a breed with a tendency to choose its own direction over following a handlers instruction. This is NOT a bad thing in a Beagle, this is as a Beagle should be, while this does make the Beagle occasionally difficult as a pet, it should be viewed as a necessary part of "Beagledom" rather than a bad habit that needs to be broken. BEAGLES CAN IN FACT BE TRAINED to be as obedient as any other breed, however, you will need to find creative motivations to train your Beagle beyond simply asking it to do as it is told.

The often hear Beagles referred to as "runners"...or dogs whom will wander off...as though it is some sort of flaw in the breed. It is true that the Beagle will wander off when unsupervised. They will dart out a door that is opened and not watched closely. The Beagle should be leashed (*or at least VERY closely supervised*) at all times. They will dart and go roaming when the motivation strikes them to do so, this is however not a flaw in the breed, it is the nature of the breed, one cannot expect a Beagle to behave like a Labrador or Poodle. They are different dogs. If having a dog who needs this sort of close supervision is not what you want in a dog, then I would suggest a different breed of dog. As mentioned above the Beagles breeding means that the Beagle is somewhat of a free thinker rather than stubborn, it is not that a Beagle cannot be trained not to wander off, because they can, HOWEVER... this training should never be completely relied upon and a watchful eye should be kept on the most well trained Beagle.

Nose deafness is a slang terminology for the Beagles tendency to not listen when scenting. We say "the nose turns on and the brain turns off", Beagles are driven by their noses, it is their nature. If you are more accustomed to dogs who will leave behind interesting scents to respond to your commands , you might consider a different breed or dog.

Beagles are far from stupid, truth is they are just smart enough to get away with not doing what you have asked them to do. People often base a dogs intelligence on its willingness and ability to follow spoken command. Following spoken commands says less about a dogs intelligence and more about its willingness to please its handler. The Beagle is both curious and intuitive, though not motivated by the same things as other breeds, where a Labrador is highly motivated to do whatever it takes to make its handler happy, the Beagles is somewhat more of an individual free thinker. People who say the Beagle is stupid likely never took the time to find what motivates their Beagle to respond. Beagles have profound problem solving ability.

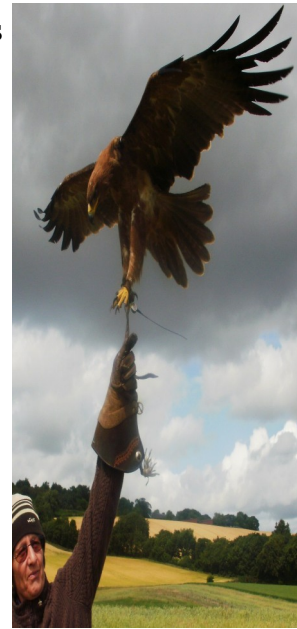

## Meet Your Judge



I grew up in the harsh farming community the Angus glens in Scotland where all dogs were working dogs and pets unheard of. Our family dogs were West Highland terriers, Smooth Coated and Border Collies with temperaments as mean and unforgiving as the weather. They did their jobs as was expected of their breeds, and were highly valued for their endurance. A nip or bite from one of these dogs wasn't uncommon and in those days good working dogs were worth more than children, so we just had to put up with it.

During my teens and twenties I was actively involved in the Game Shooting industry and trained and worked my own Labradors and an English Springer Spaniel on the Grouse moors of Scotland and York-

shire, as water and dry land retrievers. Frequently I was contracted to work the pheasant and partridge shoots in the valleys and lowlands for the local gentry and visiting aristocracy. It was great fun and I came to regard dogs as working entities with abilities that outpaced their human handlers, and determination which always saw the job done. I learned to judge a dog's physique, movement and work capacity, to value the attributes that developed the breed and to be humble in the presence of a truly good dog. I also learned that not all good dogs are purebreds.

Today I have salukis.

My introduction to Lure Coursing in Queensland came quite by accident when a fellow saluki owner mentioned that her Grand Champion dog always performed better at the Shows after a weekend coursing.

My first saluki, Emma, was as predictable as the Melbourne weather...one day she would run, then wander off, then run again etc. I doubt that she ever completed a full run in the two years I coursed her, but we had fun nonetheless and we made many good friends. Sami came next but due to an injury he was withdrawn from coursing for 5 years and returned to make a spectacular comeback and go on to win his title at 10 years of age. My greatest thrill was to see my first litter of puppies compete against each other on the field. Kallil, Aimee, Vega, Zafina, Hassan have been awarded their Field Champion titles with all, bar Hassan, attaining their Conformation titles as well.

Bibi and Ellie, my young dogs, are the grand puppies of my first saluki, Emma, and the grand nieces of Sami. All my Coursers are trained from an early age, fed specific diets and only given the most basic of obedience training. I treat my dogs as athletes and Lure Coursing as a sport.

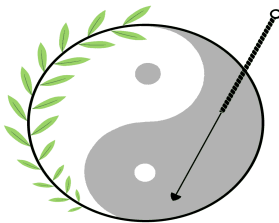

I enjoy my judging as it allows me to continue learning about new and interesting breeds, their form and function and how to evaluate their abilities. Helping new members to get more from their dogs and understand the sport is very rewarding. I am a qualified dog trainer and a member of the Australian Pet Dog Trainers Association.

My other roles this year are Fundraiser for the QLCA and Race Secretary for Warwick Club.
